### TIMELINE

We began working on health care in December 2014. The first building opened in January 2018 and by December of that year,

***Breaking news:*** On 11/20/2020, the Provincial Minister of Health licensed this facility as a ***“hospital,”*** naming it as ***“Archbishop Mark Haverland Hospital Centre Moshu.”*** and funding is due for doctors and medicines.

### HONOREE

A second building (see picture upper right re foundation construction) opened on September 30, 2020 and was dedicated to and



honors the work of Dr. Thomas P. Sculco, Surgeon-In-Chief Emeritus, at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City, ranked by U.S. News Report as Number 1 for orthopedics, 11 years in a row. After surgery elsewhere, Tom was advised to have more surgery which would result in his being in a wheelchair “for the rest of your life.” Tom sought an alternative path and then asked his wife Ann to get him on an air ambulance to get him to Dr. Sculco while strapped down to the floor of the air ambulance with two emergency personnel behind him. Ann said: “how do I do that?” Tom said: “I don’t know.” Ann used her ingenuity and problem-solving talent to get Tom on an air ambulance. After arriving in New York, Dr. Sculco admitted Tom and operated immediately. He played a remarkable role in saving Tom Wilkins’ life and allowing him to walk. Bishop Steven Ayule-Milenge, who oversees the Archbishop Mark Haverland Hospital Centre Moshu, pulled rank on Tom by saying: “*That is why I would like to suggest you to say that God saved your life not Dr. Thomas Sculco. He used the intelligence of Dr. Thomas Sculco so that you are in the present state.*” The spirit of this hospital is exemplified by Dr. Sculco who reaches out to people caught in desperate circumstances.

Dr. Thomas P. Sculco, Surgeon-In-Chief Emeritus, at The Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City and Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Weill Cornell Medical College. He oversaw the creation of the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Complex Joint Reconstruction Center, the first of its kind in the world to research and treat the most challenging joint reconstruction. He is also the author of hundreds of peer-reviewed articles on orthopedic surgery and is co-author of [Hospital for Special Surgery Orthopaedic Manual \(2013\)](#).

## THE ARCHBISHOP MARK HAVERLAND HOSPITAL CENTRE MOSHO

The hospital has staff of a priest, two doctors, an administrator, a laboratory technician, four nurses, night watchman, guards, and orderlies. This year our benefactors provided electrical power, an automobile for Bishop Steven's staff to reach the hospital on difficult roads, interior painting, construction work on the maternity building, installation of beds and equipment, and support for the staff, sdw medicines, and protective equipment.



## GOALS

- A third building to provide a post-operative pavilion with two rooms and to upgrade nursing capabilities.
- In the January-February, 2020 issue of The Trinitarian, Tom Wilkins authored an article entitled *From Strength to Strength: Congo Clinic Adds Maternity Wing* and wrote: "To deliver children from HIV mothers while not treating both the mother and the child is an ethical matter which must be avoided. Hence, we strive to be "wise as serpents and harmless as doves." He cited a report from Bristol Myers Squibb Foundation estimating that ninety percent of children worldwide living with HIV are born in sub-Saharan Africa.
- Gastroenteritis and other waterborne diseases are prevalent in this area, according to a manuscript by Murphy Kabamba, M.D. Our long-term goal is to provide water drilled from the ground.

## MEMORIAL

Father Keith Coyner was born in April 13, 1939. He graduated from Indiana University in 1960 with a bachelor's degree and seven years later from Indiana State University with a master's degree.



He was employed by Shelbyville High School and then Pike High School where he served as an English teacher. He left teaching in 1983 and went to seminary and was ordained as a priest in 1985.

He was devoted to his family, friends and parishioners. The main focus of his life was helping people. He is survived by his son Kevin Alan Junken Coyer, his daughter Sarah Elizabeth Dorothea Buitendyk and 6 grandchildren.
